
Color the picture of the Lifecycle of a Butterfly. Then use the Bolded words to complete the cycle.

- Adult the winged adult which will mate and reproduce.
- <u>Larva</u> The larva spends its time eating, growing and molting (shedding its outgrown exoskeleton).
- <u>Pupa</u> the stage in a butterfly's life when it is encased in a Chrysalis and undergoes metamorphosis into the adult.
- <u>Egg</u> the tiny orb laid by a female butterfly. Eggs are usually laid on the underside of leaves they hatch into larvae.
