

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EMB Talking Cards – Rules

Divide the class into groups of four students. Each group needs **a deck of cards** and **a copy of the discussion sheets** (four pages). Each player is given a discussion page (spades, hearts, clubs or diamonds).

Place the deck of cards face down on the table and students take turns picking up the top card and saying it aloud (e.g. Eight of Spades). The student who has the corresponding question to that card on their discussion sheet reads it out and the student who picked up the corresponding card starts the discussion. The other players are invited to take part in the discussion and give their view on the subject.
