The workshop is dedicated to teachers of primary and secondary education that already have a prior experience in video producing. This workshop supports teachers to:

- focus on methodologies related to documentary,
- indicate how documentary can be a multimodal, strong, informative and expressive medium,
- explore how various tools and resources can be used to enhance creativity in schools
- refine their shooting and editing techniques,
- approach creative techniques,
- focus on methodologies and educational content that could make teaching exciting and attractive to young people,
- learn and exchange the experience of creating videos with European teachers

Participants should have basic knowledge in ICT, Web 2.0 tools, video production. At the end of the workshop, the participants will receive a diploma and a leaflet containing the guidelines to create documentaries in their schools.
