The International Olympic Academy (IOA), in cooperation with Harvard's Center for Hellenic Studies (CHS), is organizing the Third International Scholars' Symposium on "Sports, Society and Culture" in Ancient Olympia, on July 9-12, 2014. As in the past years, the Symposium will host scholars from around the world and bring together more than a hundred students and professors from Greek and American Universities.

Topic

Building on some of the themes that were developed in the previous years, the specific topic of the 2014 Symposium is "Revisiting the Past, Understanding the Present." Its purpose is to establish comparisons between Antiquity and the modern Olympic tradition and to show the significance of the past in dealing with contemporary challenges.

Structure

Rather than placing emphasis on lectures, this year's Symposium will be based on innovative educational methods such as blended learning and student workshops. Students will have access to a set of core readings and presentationabstracts in advance of the Symposium. Presentations will be short, and followed byworkshopsduring which the students will have the opportunity to discuss the readings and reflect on the themes of the presentations in small groups.

Participants

The Symposium is addressed only to undergraduate students who are in their senior year of studies (4th year and above), as well as postgraduate students (Masters and PhD students).

Participation and Logistics

The International Olympic Academy will facilitate -by bus- the transportation of the participants from Athens to Olympia on Wednesday July 9 and from Olympia to Athens on Saturday July 12. Accommodation (double room) and meals (Breakfast, Lunch) on the IOA premises will also be offered by the International Olympic Academy.

This is a no-fee based event, and the participants will be given certificates of attendance during the closing ceremony of the Symposium.

The application will open on Tuesday, April 1, 2014.

The deadline for all submissions is Thursday, May 15, 2014.
