A Dream school

Humaira Bachal, a Pakistani woman, has overcome many obstacles in order to set up a school for poor children from her neighbourhood. In Moach Goth, the <u>slum</u> in the Pakistani city of Karachi where Humaira grew up, very few children went to school. Many families couldn't afford to pay school fees, buy books or cover the other expenses involved. Also, there were people with conservative attitudes who didn't approve of girls going to school. Some children worked in local factories to earn money for their families.

Humaira's mother wanted more for her children. She persuaded her husband to send Humaira and her sister to school. Humaira worked hard at school and felt sorry for her friends who didn't have the opportunity to get an education. Then she had a brainwave! She collected old school books and stationery from her classmates and started teaching girls from her neighbourhood at home. The idea was an instant success. Every afternoon the Bachal's kitchen would fill up with girls waiting for Humaira to share what she had learnt that day.

By 2005, when Humaira was 15, there simply wasn't room in her house for all the children who wanted to come to her lesson and she was under pressure from her father who wanted her <u>to drop school and get</u> <u>married.</u>

However Humaira was determined to continue both her studies and her teaching work. <u>She persuaded her father to allow her to finish</u> <u>school</u> and she also contacted the ARM Youth Welfare Society, an organization that helped her get funding to rent a building and buy school supplies. Today the school has 22 volunteer teachers aged between 13 and 24!

Humaira has made a huge difference in Moach Goth and although she "retired" from teaching at the school in 2007, she is still closely involved with it, helping the staff raise money in order to build their own school. <u>ACTIVITY 1</u>.
